HIPSIR is part of Hekima College (founded 1984), which is a constituent college of the Catholic University of Eastern Africa (CUEA). HIPSIR is run by Jesuits (a.k.a. Society of Jesus, an international Catholic religious order), and is therefore founded on centuries of Jesuit educational tradition which puts emphasis on academic excellence and full human formation with a view to changing our society into better place. Jesuits run 220 universities and institutions of higher learning all over the world. The first Jesuit University, The Gregorian University, was founded in 1651.

Since its founding in 2004, the MA program at HIPSIR has received and graduated one hundred and four (104) students from diverse religious and political affiliations coming from different parts of Africa, Asia, Europe and Latin America.

HIPSIR has a large continental and international network through Jesuit and non-Jesuit educational and social justice institutions – this enriches the experiences of different participants to the program.
